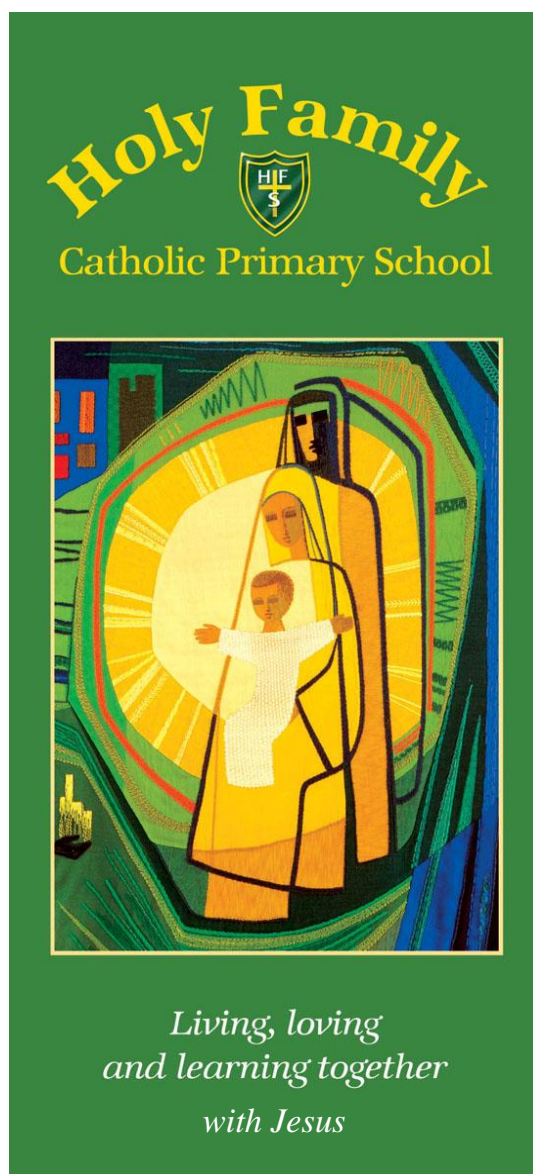

Introduction

This policy has been drawn up with the full agreement of the Governors and Staff. The wearing of school uniform is a condition of admission. Children will be expected to wear school uniform at all times, keeping tidy and smart and taking pride in their appearance and of their school. We believe that school uniform plays a role in contributing to the ethos of the school and promotes a sense of identity, community and belonging towards the school, promoting egalitarianism within the whole school body. The uniform also ensures both to parents and teachers that the child is wearing clothes that are suitable for work in school, thus removing potential problem with ever changing fashion.

Uniform

No variations or deviations to the school uniform will be acceptable.

Apart from our tie, all uniform is available to purchase from Personalise, 24 Crittall Road, Witham, CM8 3DR. Non logo uniform can also be worn if the jumpers/cardigans/polo shirts are bottle green. These may be purchased from any High Street or online outlet

The tie is available from our School Office.

Good quality second-hand uniform is available from the school uniform store, either for free or for a small donation.

WINTER

Outdoor coat in a plain colour and plain black shoes (no trainers)

Children to wear:	
Charcoal Grey Trousers	Charcoal Grey Skirt (knee-high in length)/Pinafore/Grey Trousers
White Shirt	White Shirt
School Tie	School Tie
Knitted Bottle Green Jumper	Knitted Bottle Green Jumper/Cardigan
Grey or Black Socks	White, Green, Black or Grey Socks or Tights

SUMMER

Children may wear Winter uniform in the Summer and plain black shoes with a low heel (no trainers)

Children to wear:	
Charcoal Grey Trousers/Shorts	Green and White Check Dress (knee-high in length – no lace or braid trim) Charcoal Grey Skirt (knee-high in length)/Pinafore/Grey Trousers
Bottle Green Polo Shirt or White Shirt	Bottle Green Polo Shirt or White Blouse
School Tie (worn with White Shirt)	School Tie (worn with White Blouse)
Knitted Bottle Green Jumper	Knitted Bottle Green Jumper/Cardigan
Grey or black Socks	White, green, black or grey socks

PE CLOTHING

Plain White T-Shirt or Logo printed

Black Shorts

Black Plimsolls – slip on / lace tie

Green Fleece/Green Sweatshirt (colder weather)

Plain Black Jogging Bottoms (colder weather)

Trainers (for outdoor use)

Personal Appearance

- No Exaggerated Hairstyles (including colours and gels) – no Mohican, zigzag, star or patterns shaved into the hair.
- Shoulder length hair and longer must be tied back.
- Hair Accessories must be small and in the school colours, i.e. Green or Black.
- No Nail Varnish/gels/false nails.
- No make-up.

Earrings

Children are allowed to wear small plain studs only. Earrings are not to be worn during PE. If newly pierced ears have not healed participation in PE lessons will not be allowed until the earrings can be removed. Class teachers give details of PE lessons at the start of an academic year so that earrings can be removed at home and not worn on that day if your child is unable to take them out for themselves.

No other body piercings are allowed.

Book Bags

Your child will need a small Book Bag to bring their book and Home/School Contact Book into school. The use of rucksacks should only be for swimming or after school sports clubs.

Labelling of School Uniform

Parents must label all items of school uniform, including shoes and plimsolls. The school cannot accept any responsibility for items of clothing lost in school.

Governors Role

It is the Governors' responsibility that the school uniform meets all the regulations concerning equal opportunities including introducing a gender-neutral uniform.

Any request based on social or cultural grounds for pupils to wear items of clothing, other than, or in addition to, the specified uniform, will be considered.
